## The Pastor's Corner

Do you remember the first time you went to the guidance counselor's office? I remember! It happened when I was in middle school, about 7th grade. At my school, this was when they would first take each of us out of our class for an hour to meet with the person who was to help us decide what we would do for a living.

Our guidance counselor would ask us what kind of job we thought we would like to do when we were older. This counselor was a woman, and she had a large collection of VCR tapes, each about a particular vocation. Based on our response to her question, she would take out the most closely matching tape, and she'd put it into this VCR, and give us a set of headphones, so we could watch and listen to it. It told us all the statistics about our chosen job.

We were taken to the guidance office two students at a time. I went back with another kid named Josh. The guidance counselor asked me first what I wanted to do...I can't even remember what I said in 7<sup>th</sup> grade...but she put in the corresponding tape for me to view.

Then she began to talk to Josh. She asked Josh what he wanted to do, and he said, "I'd like to write cartoons."

She responded, "That's not a real job."

Josh said, "But that's what I really want to do."

She told him, "Most people can't make a living doing that...you have to pick one of the vocations on the tapes."

So Josh finally picked another one. Here's the deal. Throughout our lives, the culture of the world will try to change us. The culture will tell us that we need to do these certain things to be happy, or that we need to have certain items, or certain relationships, in order to live and have a sense of purpose and fulfilment.

But often, it just isn't true. As followers of Christ we must live to change the world, not have the world change us! Sometimes, this means we need to be different and not follow what the world says our path should be.

Jesus put it this way in John 17:15, when he prayed for his followers and said,

15 I'm not asking you to take them out of the world, but to keep them safe from the evil one. 16 They do not belong to this world any more than I do. John 17:15-16 (NLT)

If you think about it, this world really isn't our home, anyway.
