The Difference between Descriptive and Prescriptive Scripture Passages

This past week, I ran into a friend of mine who happens to be a Jehovah's Witness. Every time I see him, he "tests" me. He wants to give me something to think about. This particular day, he asked me if I was celebrating Christmas.

I said, "Certainly," while smiling, knowing what was going to come next!

He responded, "You know, the only two birthdays celebrated in the Bible led to trouble".

I said, "Well, John the Baptist seemed pretty excited about the coming of Christ...he even jumped when he was still in his mother's womb." And we left it at that.

Now the two passages about birthdays that my friend was referring to come from Genesis chapter 40 and Matthew chapter 14.

The Genesis passage goes like this,

²⁰ Pharaoh's birthday came three days later, and he prepared a banquet for all his officials and staff. He summoned his chief cup-bearer and chief baker to join the other officials.²¹ He then restored the chief cup-bearer to his former position, so he could again hand Pharaoh his cup.²² But Pharaoh impaled the chief baker, just as Joseph had predicted when he interpreted his dream. Gen 40:20-22 (NLT)

Here Pharaoh was celebrating his birthday...and just as Joseph had said, the chief baker of the palace was impaled.

The second passage is from the Gospel of Matthew; it goes like this,

⁶ But at a birthday party for Herod, Herodias's daughter performed a dance that greatly pleased him, ⁷ so he promised with a vow to give her anything she wanted. ⁸ At her mother's urging, the girl said, "I want the

head of John the Baptist on a tray!" Then the king regretted what he had said; but because of the vow he

had made in front of his guests, he issued the necessary orders. ¹⁰ So John was beheaded in the prison, ¹¹ and his head was brought on a tray and given to the girl, who took it to her mother. Matt 14:6-11 (NLT)

In this passage, Herod ends up beheading John the Baptist because of a promise that he made to Herodias. My friend's point was that one can simply read these two passages and see that celebrating birthdays leads to trouble.

However, if you read both of these scriptures carefully, neither one of them says that we should not celebrate birthdays (or Christmas, by implication). They just describe what happened on these particular birthdays. In fact, in the Genesis passage, it's true that the baker was impaled...but it's also true that the cupbearer was brought out of prison, vindicated and restored on the same day.

This being the case, we have to be careful when reading scripture. Sometimes we are told information that is part of the story, but we draw too much from it. We make scripture say things that were never intended.

Now the truth is, beyond just the Jehovah's Witnesses, there are many other people that decide they don't want to have a Christmas tree, or they don't want to have an Advent wreath...because of the pagan superstitions that were originally associated with these ideas.

So what are we to do? How do we handle these situations? Is it right to celebrate Christmas and birthdays, or not?

Thankfully, scripture does give us the answer...because in the book of Romans, Paul tells us not to argue about whether we celebrate different holidays. He tells us,

⁵ In the same way, some think one day is more holy than another day, while others think every day is alike. You should each be fully convinced that whichever day you choose is acceptable. Romans 14:5 (NLT)

If you read the prior verses of Romans 14 to get the context, you can clearly see that Paul is telling believers how to handle differences. Whether it be what food

people eat, or what days people celebrate, these things are secondary issues, and people are free to choose for themselves what days are special.

You see, the Romans passage is a PRESCRIPTIVE passage. Paul is telling the church "HOW" to handle different situations. The Genesis and Matthew passages were DESCRIPTIVE passages; they were simply telling "WHAT" happened on a given day. When we're reading our Bibles, we need to be attentive to this difference.
