#### The Pastor's Corner

"You are standing in an open field west of a white house, with a boarded front door. There is a small mailbox here."

This is the beginning line to an adventure game by Infocom called, "Zork", released in the early 1980s. I had a copy that I played with my friends on a Commodore computer. It was an old game, one of the first text based adventure games ever made. It was like playing a book. You read what happened, and then you responded with what to do next.

The game was so popular, that in March of 2007, *The New York Times* published a list of the 10 most important video games of all time. "Zork" came in 3<sup>rd</sup> on the list, just above "Tetris", which fell fittingly at number 4.

In "Zork", you play as an adventurer exploring the ruins of a vast underground civilization that was found beneath the trap door of your white house. You explore the ruins, collect objects, and bring them back up into the house. Once you're back up inside, you can put the valuable objects from your adventures below in a display case.

A person wins the game by successfully going down into the cavern, bringing up all of the treasures, and putting them into the display case without dying or having a thief steal them. The game could be extremely frustrating, because it was very easy to die. Wikipedia says that there were at least 28 different ways for your character to die in "Zork". But it was still a fun game!

If you look at another way, however, the adventurer character in "Zork" has a really sad life: basically alone, with no real purpose for existence except avoiding death, collecting treasures, and bringing them back to the house.

At this point it hit me...if you think about the "winner" of the game...the one who collects all of these treasures without dying. What do you think Jesus would say to him/or her...If He entered the game right at that point, right when he or she had placed the last treasure in the trophy case? I think we already know what Christ would say.

Jesus once met a man who basically was winning at the game of life. He had accumulated a lot of stuff, while at the same time keeping the basic commandments. What did Jesus tell him?

**21** Jesus told him, "If you want to be perfect, go and sell all your possessions and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." Matthew 19:21 (NLT)

That's when the true adventure in life begins--when you find Jesus and follow Him.

In life...so many people are stuck in the same predicament...just existing and collecting stuff...because they've never really found the real Door.

# What Door am I talking about? Look at John 10:7-10,

So Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the <u>door</u> of the sheep. <sup>8</sup> All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. <sup>9</sup> I am the <u>door</u>. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. <sup>10</sup> The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. John 10:7-10 (ESV)

Jesus is the Door that we all need to find. What then follows is truly a great adventure. There is so much more to life than just accumulating possessions in one's house.
