The Pastor's Corner

I was really excited last week, because the Pittsburgh Penguins hockey team won the Stanley Cup! I'm also hopeful for the future, because the last two times that the Pens have won the cup in the spring, the Steelers have followed up by winning the Super Bowl in the fall. So here's to hoping that the Steelers can do their part and complete the hat trick!

One of the things that I did during this last playoff series between my Pittsburgh Penguins and the opposing San Jose Sharks, is I made a hype video. I already knew what I wanted to uses as a prop. Vacation Bible School was over, and I had noticed that we had these inflatable Shark decorations left in the sanctuary. I asked Kelly if I could have one to destroy, in hopes of inspiring my team to victory. She laughed and said, "Okay".

Here's what I did: I took the decoration outside and inflated it as much as I could...it was huge! I then placed it in the parking lot in front of an empty garbage can. I went inside and got one of my hockey sticks, and I glued a thumb tack to it with some super glue. I went back outside and got a hockey ball and put on my inline skates. I asked Julie if she would record me on my phone, and she agreed.

The plan was simple...I was going to stick handle with the hockey ball, and then shoot it past the shark into the garbage can. After this, I was going to hit the shark with my hockey stick where the thumbtack was glued, and the idea was that it would explode. I thought that this would be easy, and that it would take about 5 minutes.

But it's much harder to score past an inflated shark than it looks, especially when you haven't played in a while. It took me three tries before I was able to shoot the ball past the shark into the can. And the first time I scored, I still wasn't happy with the shot. I put the ball in the can...but not with

authority. So I told Julie I wanted to redo it and record it again.

It took two more tries before I finally shot the ball the way I wanted into the can...but then when I hit the shark with my stick, the tack broke off, so the inflated shark didn't explode. At this point I also had to spend another five minutes finding the tack so that no one ended up with a flat tire. All to make a video in which I still wasn't 100 percent satisfied (because it would have been 10 times cooler if that shark would have exploded.)

Now, what could possibly be the spiritual point of any of this? Well, today, a lot of people say that they believe in reincarnation. And they like the idea of karma...the concept that if one does more good than bad, then their next life will be better (and viceversa).

But people don't think this through to its logical conclusion. I like the way author Mark Becker puts it:

"In much of the Orient, this strict belief in karma has resulted in a hopeless, pessimistic view of life. Their lives are seen as dreary, endless cycles of suffering and rebirth. Because of this endless chain of karma, reincarnation does not resolve the problem of evil, but simply points toward the impossible goal of perfection"

Think about it. I was frustrated because I had to record a video over and over again, never really getting it right. Imagine how sad it would be to live one's life over and over; never really accomplishing enough to be satisfied, or even to end the cycle.

Thankfully we don't need to keep trying again and again in vain to live the perfect life. Jesus has already done it for us. As the author of Hebrews pust it, (continued on back of page)

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us. We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith. Heb 12:1-2 (NLT)

Christ is the champion who lived the perfect life. We just need to keep our eyes on Him. We don't have to be caught in a cycle of dreariness, where we can never measure up. Our Savior paid the price for us. He's already completed the perfect take on our behalf! We just have to be willing to accept it.


