The Pastor's Corner

I'm actually writing this newsletter article while looking out at the Atlantic Ocean! Julie and I enjoy visiting the beach for vacation. This year we're at Virginia Beach. I'm having a lot of fun skating on the boardwalk.

Now when I'm skating, I normally begin wherever our hotel is, then skate the whole way to one side of the boardwalk, then turn around and skate the whole way to the other, and then it's back to the hotel. Since our hotel is somewhat in the middle, I'm actually skating more than the entire length of the boardwalk (3 miles) each time!

In every instance when I arrive at one end of the boardwalk, I do something some people might consider quirky. At both ends of the Virginia Beach boardwalk there are silver rails. Each time I come to the end, I always slow down so I can reach out and touch the rail. I do this at both ends. In this way, I feel that I have really skated the ENTIRE length of the boardwalk.

I have seen a couple of other people do this same thing, but most of the time, when skaters, runners, or bikers get close to the end, they simply turn around. They don't go the whole way to the rail. It just doesn't make sense to me...why go all that way without really finishing?

I think there are many people that treat their faith in the same way. Many people are aware of Christ's existence, they know that God made the universe, and they are aware of their sin...but they never make the necessary step of accepting Christ as their Savior and Lord. They stop just short. How sad it is!

In the Old Testament, David once lamented the death of his friend, Abner. Abner had killed one of Joab's relatives in self-defense. A little while later, Joab caught up with Abner right outside the gates of the city of Hebron. At that time, Hebron was a

city of refuge; if you unintentionally killed someone, you were safe inside that city. But instead of rushing into the city, Abner stepped to the side to speak to Joab...and there he was killed.

King David was so sad about what had happened to Abner that he wrote a song. In Second Samuel, chapter 3, we read,

31 Then David said to Joab and all those who were with him, "Tear your clothes and put on burlap. Mourn for Abner." And King David himself walked behind the procession to the grave. They buried Abner in Hebron, and the king and all the people wept at his graveside. Then the king sang this funeral song for Abner:

"Should Abner have died as fools die? 34 Your hands were not bound; your feet were not chained. No, you were murdered— the victim of a wicked plot." 2 Sam 3:31-34 (NLT)

David said that "Abner died as fools die"...in other words, David was saying that Abner died steps away from safety. Many people are convicted by the Holy Spirit of their need to repent and come to Christ. But so many people put off the decision. They think that there will be a better time later.

But we're not guaranteed the future. Any moment could be our last. If a person has a decision to make for Christ, today is the day to do it. As Paul put it in 2 Corinthians 6:2, "Today is the day of salvation."




IT'S HOEDOWN TIME!
