The Pastor's Corner

The weather is finally starting to get chilly! I was reading a website called, The Rabbit Room, where one of my favorite songwriters, Andrew Peterson, often discusses the meaning behind the lyrics of his songs. He was making a comment about a song that he performed called, "All Shall be Well." He used an illustration from people who live in colder climates. He said,

"Those of you who live in cold climates know about 'the river going out.' I remember seeing in a town in Minnesota an old car parked on a frozen river where everyone could see it. The town held a yearly raffle to predict what day of the spring thaw the car would finally sink through the ice.

Well, in Alaska there's much speculation about which day of spring the ice on the rivers will break apart and pour into the ocean. It apparently all happens in one raucous moment."

One time, Mr. Peterson came to Alaska for a concert just two days after that river ice-breaking had taken place. He said it was the talk of the town. The songwriter mentioned that these conversations reminded him of the thawing of the heart of the prodigal son and his eventual return to the arms of his loving father.

If we really think about it, we don't know what words, or what actions, God may use to open up a person's heart to the Gospel. Like the people in the Minnesota town, we can't predict the day that a person will accept Christ.

But we're still to do all that we can to bring people into that relationship! Maybe you know someone whose heart has gone cold; someone who has drifted away from the truth. We're to do all we can to bring these people back. We don't know if the

Holy Spirit will thaw their hard hearts. But we're called to bring them back towards places of warmth.

In the Bible, James put it this way:

¹⁹ My dear brothers and sisters, if someone among you wanders away from the truth and is brought back,²⁰ you can be sure that whoever brings the sinner back will save that person from death and bring about the forgiveness of many sins. James 5:19-20 (NLT)


